


PASTOR'S DESK BY PASTOR MICHELE KAUFMAN

The twelfth man tradition is one of the great legends of sports. Most people are not accustomed to seeing the entire Texas A&M student body stand throughout an entire football game except during halftime. This unique Texas tradition is based on something that happened in 1922. A&M was facing Centre College. The A&M team had so many injuries that Coach Bible wasn't sure he'd have enough to players to complete the game. Then Coach Bible remembered seeing a former player, E. King Gill, sitting in the stands. The coach had released Gill from football to play basketball. Coach Bible had Gill brought down from the stands and suited up on the sidelines so he would be available to play should the Aggie team need him. Gill became the team's twelfth man. The Aggies went on to win without Gill's help, but on that day a tradition was born. To this day hard-core A&M fans stand ready, as a body, to show their willingness to play if needed, to be the twelfth man.

I think a lot of church folks view themselves as the twelfth man. How many folks come dressed up every Sunday morning standing ready, as a body, to show their willingness to play if needed, to be the twelfth man, but never get on the field. They never volunteer to teach a Sunday School class, or volunteer to work on the Stewardship campaign, or help with the fellowship dinners, or invite friends to worship or any of the various ministries that help the church carry out its work. They have good intentions, but then we all know about the road paved with good intentions. Nobody can do everything that is required to move a church forward, but all of us can do something. We are church.

The Apostle Paul teaches in 1 Corinthians 12 and elsewhere that the Lord's people are the body of Christ. Each part is a part of the whole body. The body is an assembly of parts. Without its parts, the body is not. By its parts, the body exists. But a number of severed parts do not make a body, it is their assembly, their being together, which does that. Not only does one member of the Christian community need each other member, but each needs every other. A hand cannot function unless it is organically related to a body, unless it is what the body needs it to be, unless it does what the body needs to have it do.

Paul wanted the people within the church to work together as a team. Each person possesses a different yet complementary gift that when used together builds up the church. We are incorporated into the body of Christ. Paul asks, "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" The church is more than brick and mortar; it is the people. We are the church together! We are God's temple with the Spirit dwelling in us. Ask yourself...how can you become involved in the work of St. John's? What can you do? Don't stand on the sideline as the 12th man.

Thursday, May 13, 2021

ROLL CALL:

Those in attendance were Pastor Michele Kaufman, Don Wenner, Jr., Donna Cassarella, Jim Cassarella, Carolyn Kuehn, Jennifer Cipriani, Janet Brady, Sheila Maslo, Kim Deliman, and Kim Washko. Patty Phile and Jan Jacobus had excused absences. The meeting started at 7:14 pm.

DEVOTIONS:

Pastor Michele had the devotions and opening prayer. Don Wenner, Jr. will have the devotions for June.

LETTER:

A letter was received from Joyce Ray stating that she is leaving the church for personal reasons. Sheila Maslo made a motion to regretfully accept her letter of leaving the church. Jim Cassarella seconded the motion. All approved except for Kim Washko who abstained from voting. Kim Deliman made a motion to table what to do about Joyce's leaving. Sheila Maslo seconded the motion. All approved.

MINUTES:

April 8, 2021 – Donna Cassarella made a motion to accept the Minutes as written. Janet Brady seconded the motion. All approved except for Kim Washko and Sheila Maslo who abstained because they were not at that meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

a. Jennifer just got off the phone with the postal investigator regarding our bank fraud. He said he is working on it and in the process of tracking down the people responsible. He has over 100 cases right now. There is nothing else for us to do at this point. Jennifer also reached out to the bank to find out the status of getting our money back. She said she will look into it, however it is typically about 90 days. We are at about 60 days right now so hopefully soon. She will get back with Jennifer when she has more info.

b. Our church has collected \$1,141.00 for the local fire victims – David Cunfer and his nephew, Charles Switzer. LCW will donate money also. Donna Cassarella made a motion for the funds from the church to be divided equally in half to David Cunfer and Charles Switzer.

c. The sausage supper made \$6,332.00. After paying for the sausage and supplies, etc. our profit was \$4,642.85. 562 tickets were sold.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Don Wenner, Jr., Chairperson

a. No word from the estate of Warren Becker. Money to be put into a CD account.

b. No one contacted us about the CD's for the zoom meeting from Season's Change Financial. They sent a contract to sign without any discussion with them. Several sites were looked at online, but it was decided to go back with Mission Investments. Kim Washko made a motion to go back to Mission Investments. Donna Cassarella seconded the motion. All approved.

MILEAGE/PASTOR'S REPORT:

March – Pastor had a lot of phone calls and communion visits for a total of 51-1/2 hours and 331 miles. April – Pastor had phone calls, confirmation classes and a visitation for a total of 12 hours and 66 miles. Confirmation classes started up again. There are 2 children now and probably 4 in September.

TEAM REPORTS:

Worship and Music -

a. Jennifer Cipriani made a motion to keep the wooden cross up all year. It should be draped with the appropriate colors for special seasons and occasions. Sheila Maslo seconded the motion. All approved.b. The hymnals will be put back in the pews that we sit in. See "Team Reports, New Business, D" below.

Property - Jim Cassarella, Chairman

Donna Cassarella made a motion to accept the bid for the steps. Money to come from the Building Fund. Kim Washko seconded the motion. All approved. Jim Cassarella made a motion to fix the sidewalk out front. Money to come from the Building Fund. George Hess will supply the concrete. Kim Washko seconded the motion. All approved. Kim Washko made a motion to empty the tank in back of the church because of liability and hazard purposes. George Hess will donate the slurry to fill the tank. If any funds are needed, they will be taken from the Building Fund. Janet Brady seconded the motion. All approved.

b. The Synod Assembly is Friday, June 4th and Saturday, June 5th and will be virtual. Jan Jacobus and Kim Deliman will represent St. John's.

c. Phone numbers should not be given out to strangers. Get their name and phone number and pass it along to that person. They can call them back.

d. A discussion was had about bringing the church services back to the way they were before COVID. It was decided to put the hymnals back in the pews but not use them until June 6th. Right now, we will sing 2 verses only. If you have your vaccinations and feel comfortable, you don't have to wear a mask. This is your preference. This also starts in June. Sheila Maslo made a motion to put the hymnals back in the pews but don't use them yet. We will only sing 2 verses until June. Masks will be optional starting in June also. Donna Cassarella seconded the motion. All approved.

e. Pastor asked if we have a church banner. All churches are asked to display their banners at the Bishop's installation.

f. Thelma's 90 days are up. Should we pay her clearances now? Donna Cassarella made a motion to pay Thelma's clearances now that the 90 days are up. Kim Deliman seconded the motion. All approved.
