


### From Pastor Michele Kaufman

And so it begins, the season of Advent, a time of preparation, a time of going toward the coming again of the Messiah, a time of great expectation and great anticipation. But exactly what is it that we anticipate? What are we getting ready for? What do we expect to happen? Do we anticipate the end of the world, as some religious cults always do at this time of the year? Are we preparing our hearts and spirits to receive again the coming, the coming of the Christ child into the world?

Advent has nothing to do with the number of shopping days left until Xmas. With the hanging of the greens, the placement of the poinsettias, the lighting of the first Advent candle — all these invite us to dream dreams of a better world, to allow expectant visions that have nothing to do with sugar-plum fairies to dance in our heads. Advent invites us to fill the cup of today with a full measure of tomorrow.

The way we see Advent and Christmas will determine our approach to the celebration. Is the essential work of Advent hanging decorations or is it more about opening our lives to the coming Christ and learning to live in peace? Will Christmas come only if we do all the right things to get ready for it? Or, is Christmas a gift from God that arrives whether we're ready for it or not?

We need to get our lives in order or we will miss the whole thing. The truth of the matter is that God's entrance into our lives in the person of Jesus Christ occurs at God's initiative and not ours. Christ arrives in our midst not as a reward for our careful preparation for his coming, but as a result of the love and compassion of God. Christ comes to us whether we're ready or not. Matthew describes the gift of the season of Advent with a single word, my personal favorite of all the "Christmas words" – Emmanuel, God with us. Not God HAS BEEN with us; not God WILL BE with us; but God WITH us, right now, TODAY!

Otherwise, any <u>voting member</u> of the congregation (confirmed member, who has communed and has made a contribution of record during the current or preceding year), is <u>18 years of age or older</u>, may be elected (St. John's constitution, chapter 12).

Learning Ministry is facing a challenge and we need your help. We have been struggling to keep the Youth Sunday School Program going this year. We still do not have a teacher. Sunday School is being covered by volunteers on a



month-to-month basis. It is with regret and sadness that we made the decision not to offer Sunday School in January and February. We are hoping to take this time to regroup and move forward with plans for the future. In Order to start SS back up in March, we need volunteers to help us support the children with their classes. Sunday School runs until the end of May. That means we still need to cover three months of instruction. Prayerfully consider giving your time to the kids on a weekly or monthly basis. Team up with someone if you are not comfortable doing it alone. Any help would be greatly appreciated. It isn't necessary to figure out lesson plans. We have an easy curriculum available to use and explore together. Weekly, monthly or permanent volunteer would be a blessing. It is so important for the children to have a strong foundation in their faith and that begins with Sunday School. Will you answer that calling? The Learning Ministry also discussed the possibility of moving lessons to a weeknight. The thought was that maybe someone would be available to lead the children at a different time, thus opening up the possibility for volunteers and children to grow in faith. This was just an idea we discussed. Again, this option would depend on volunteers. We would welcome any thoughts and input on changing to a weeknight. Would we have more volunteers / more children able to come? We do not know. Our SS group is small in numbers but not small in the need to continue growing through instruction and fun. We are open to any suggestions on how to make this happen. 



In December 1992 in Harrington, Maine, wreath maker Morrill Worcester found himself with a surplus of 5,000 wreaths during the holiday season. Worcester saw the surplus as an opportunity to pay tribute to our country's veterans and with the help of Maine Senator Olympia Snowe, arranged for the wreaths to be placed at Arlington National Cemetery. This annual tribute to our country's veterans has continued ever since, touching the lives of millions of veterans' families and volunteers and growing in scope through the years.



In 2007, the Worcester family along with veterans and volunteers formed the non-profit organization Wreaths Across America to continue and expand their efforts at Arlington National Cemetery and to support those around the country who wished to do the same. Wreaths Across America's mission is simple: Remember the fallen, Honor those that serve, and Teach the next generation about the value of freedom. Morrill's wife, Karen, has served as the organization's volunteer Executive Director since the non-profit was created and today oversees what has become a massive volunteer organization that continues to grow. In 2021 alone, Wreaths Across America and its national network of volunteers placed over 2.4 million veterans' wreaths at over 3,100 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad.

This year, National Wreaths Across America day will be held on Saturday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Locally, a ceremony will begin at noon followed by the placement of wreaths at St. John's Lutheran & Reformed Cemetery located at 772 St. John's Road where approximately 330 local veterans are laid to rest. This is open to anyone who would like to attend.

This is the first year wreaths will be placed at this location. This year our goal is to place 330 wreaths. With your generosity, we are hoping to meet this goal and ensure no veteran is forgotten. Each hand made, fresh, live wreath cost \$15 to sponsor and is made in the United States with Maine balsam.
