#### **From Pastor Michele Kaufman**

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want; He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside still waters, He restores my soul...

I want you to imagine for a moment that you are in your favorite place —that place where you feel relaxed and calm and refreshed and happy. Is it at the ocean? In a garden? In the mountains? Maybe for you, it's a real place, or maybe it's a place you've always imagined. But I want you to take time and imagine that place right now (I'm serious.... take 2 minutes...close your eyes.... breathe in, breathe out...).

If you followed my directions, you just experienced what might be called a psychological "rest stop." A rest stop is a brief reprieve from the stresses and roller coaster of life. It's a time of relaxation, refreshment, and joy in which for a brief time, you can put your troubles aside and breathe. We all need something that breaks our stress, interrupts our pain with a little bit of pleasure and joy, something that breaks our "fasting" with a little bit of peace. How many know what we're talking about? You know, when you go traveling and you're going by car, driving for hours, and you really need a pit stop? Maybe it's a bathroom break you need, or a fresh bottle of water, or a snack, or a little nap. Or maybe you need to stretch your legs because you've been driving forever. Rest stops were created for this kind of necessary break. Day been long? Road been hard? Life been tough? Take a break. Pull over. Relax. And refresh.

I know we all believe the summer months are for just that purpose. You see, we've kind of misconstrued that word in our culture today with the idea that taking a "rest" means taking time for ourselves just to do more stuff! Or sleeping in instead of going to church! But here's the problem with that. That's not the kind of "rest" that God intended. This is why Jesus told us, "Come to me, all you who are weary, and I will give you rest." Jesus is our Sabbath. He IS our break. Sabbath is a time when we allow Jesus to refresh us, heal us, renew us, and rejuvenate us before sending us out to face the world again. Sabbath is not a time to "check out" of worship, but a need to "check into" worship! That's where the refreshment "stand" is. That's where the living water fountain flows. That's where you eat the food of holy communion and are rejuvenated in the power of the Holy Spirit. Worship is where you gear up again for the road and the way and the journey still to come. Cause if you don't refresh, you will burn out. We need to give ourselves a break, and a little downtime works well for almost everybody. It doesn't really matter what the activity or inactivity is. The idea is to give your body, mind, and heart a chance to relax and recharge. If you keep going at full speed every day, it can be really hard on you, both physically and mentally. We were not designed to go 24/7/365. But also remember how important it is to maintain your relationship with God. Making time for God will allow all the pieces of your life's puzzle to fall into place.

Pastor's Report/Mileage: April 2023 approved. 22.25 hours, mileage 220 miles. Devin Cipriani will be confirmed Pentecost Sunday. Crosses will be given to the confirmand. Homebound members have received communion. P. Michele will be attending the International Conference in Meissen with the Bishop from June 15-24<sup>th</sup>.

Minutes from March 9<sup>th</sup> approved.

Cemetery Treasurer's Report: Meeting on May 8<sup>th</sup>. Attendance from St. John's: Dawn Klick, Jennifer Cipriani, and Melody Hinderer. Items discussed:

- Cemetery will be purchasing a gas-powered leaf blower.
- Need additional help, possible donation of time.
- Plow will not be going on the white truck.
- Need to purchase industrial weed killer (either Extended Round-Up or Farm Works from Tractor Supply)
- Revision of by-laws (this was done and approved at previous meeting)
- Discussed purchasing 700 geraniums, prices are very high, looking into buying pansies (which is a perennial) instead of geraniums.
- Permanent Flower Fund (Perpetual Fund) is up for renewal. Will invest in CDs with local banks instead of Mission Investment Fund because their rates are higher. CDs will be purchased in different dollar amounts with different maturity dates in case monies are needed.
- Workman's comp went up \$500.00, no increases in truck insurance or hazard insurance.
- YTD: 4 Open/Close burials, 4 Cremations, and one lot was purchased; donations also received.
- Need to buy a load of good dirt -Bedrock's, and grass seed.
- Discussion on possibly purchasing a water buffalo to help with watering.
- Frank has talked to someone who has a backhoe to help them, too much manual labor is being done, help with cutting down hours.

#### **Continuation of Church Council Meeting...**

- Hazleton Lehighton Mission District Report Meeting April 19, 2023. Melody Hinderer attended the meeting as the council chairperson.
  - a. At the Spring Assembly we will have to elect a dean (must be a pastor.)
  - b. Bishop deForest and P. Shankweiler met with Christ, Hazleton, St. John, Brandonville, and St. John Ringtown, to help them complete their ministry profiles.
  - c. Christ Lutheran Conyngham have formed a call committee. Two attempts to find them an interim pastor did not work out.
  - d. Weatherly and White Haven have a candidate to replace P. Janell Wigan (she is now under contract with another church)
  - e. Dillon Epler, intern at St. John, Tamaqua, his internship has come to an end, Bishop deForest will decide if he is to remain there (congregation would like for him to stay)
  - f. Bill Dimmich, SALM, is looking for a church in the Bowmans Town area. He's in his 80's, very frail, hard time walking.
  - g. Synod VP Kristen Edelman-Weiner abruptly resigned at the synod council meeting.
  - h. P. Ken Melber has been approved as a candidate for synod secretary. P. Melber has two large congregations at the present time. P. Shankweiler will be resigning as secretary effective in August.
  - i. One candidate for VP Dan Raudenbush (must be a lay person)
  - j. The synod's new DEM (Director for Evangelical Mission) Deacon Kathleen Tigerman. She is looking for a place to live that has a Montessori school and a place to raise farm animals.
  - k. New SALM (Synodically Authorized Lay Person) program will move forward.
  - I. Ministry Grants are available, deadline July 31st.
  - m. National Youth Gathering Grants are also available for youth who have finished 8<sup>th</sup> grade and youth who have graduated 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
  - n. Budget for Synod used to be 14 million, it's now \$2 million.

Hazleton /Lehighton Mission District Assembly – May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023, Janet Brady and Melody Hinderer attended the meeting.

- New Dean elected: P. Cindy White. Dean must be under call in our district, dean cannot be a retired pastor.
- P. Tony Pagotto will join the Hazleton/Lehighton Mission District Council as a member of our mission district.

#### P. Shankweiler's Report

- In the last 10 years there have been 28-30 Ordinations, and 108 retirees.
- 250 congregations in our synod, 78-80 vacancies.
- 10 years ago, there were no vacancies.
- SALM program is our only hope, requires less education, and you are not considered a SALM unless you have a church. You can only do the sacraments at a designated church. Hopes are to change this rule so SALM's can go to other churches.
- SALM program lapsed because many pastors did not approve of the program.
- LAM (Lay Authorized Minister) is a new concept that has approval to move forward. A LAM would be trained to give communion, etc. but must also be able to give sermons and lead a service. The program has not been formalized yet.

#### **Continuation of Church Council Meeting...**

- Deacons have a choice to be a Word and Sacrament pastor give communion or Word and Service pastor cannot give communion.
- There is another candidate for the synod VP position.

The next council meeting is June 8th, 2023 @ 7 pm, meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm, and closed meeting by praying the Lord's Prayer.

#### **Church Parking Changes**

The Property Team is recommending a change in church parking on Sunday mornings and other church gatherings. The following changes were discussed with the church council.

Effective immediately:

If you feel comfortable crossing the road, we are asking you to park in the parking lot in order to free the parking spaces in front of the church.

New signage will soon be displayed for our handicapped area in the front of the church.

If you are facing the church, there will be six handicapped parking spaces to the left of the front entrance. Please do not park in these spaces if you do not have a handicap sign displayed. To the right of the church entrance, parking will be available for others to park who are afraid to cross the road.

There is new signage at the entrance of the cemetery which will direct those who need wheelchair access to gain entry to the church.

Our purpose is to offer parking for those with special needs and also to help our visitors who are uncertain of where to park. Thank you for your cooperation as we implement the new parking changes.
