#### The S.E.R.V.E. Team is Selling "Hearts "and Displaying "Love Letters from God"



# ELCA World Hunger's: 40 Days of Giving (Submitted by the S.E.R.V.E. Team)

Lenten season is a time in our spiritual journey to focus on the world's needs in our community and those who live in other parts of the world. There are seven suggestions to help you during the six weeks of reflection and discernment.

- 1. **Worship**: On Sunday, prepare your hearts by hearing God's word, praying, singing, and communing as you focus on hope of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- 2. **Study**: There is a free Lenten Study Guide available for each family which will enhance your journey of hope. The study guides will be provided along with your Sunday worship folder.
- 3. **Reflect**: Discuss the weekly study guide with others.
- 4. **Pray**: Pray humbly for God's care and blessings over all His creation.
- 5. **Give**: Set a goal for giving to the ELCA Hunger Appeal this Lenten season. (See below)
- 6. **Hear**: Read aloud the Bible verses selected in the Lenten Study Guide. What do the verses say to you?
- 7. **Sing**: Sing hymns with all your heart, reflect on the words to remind yourself of why Jesus Christ suffered on our behalf.

The S.E.R.V.E. Team is extending an opportunity for our congregation to have an impact on those who need a fresh water supply in poverty-stricken areas.

We would like to set a goal of \$ 500.00 that would provide two water wells that would give one thousand families access to clean, safe water.

More than two billion people live without access to safe water.

#### 811 million people are undernourished.
