36th NEPA Synod Assembly 2023

June 1-3, 2023 At Kalahari Resort Pocono Manor

I was honored to be the lay female for St. John's, at this year's Synod Assembly. The Theme for this year was "Going Beyond Death to Life". Still, on the agenda from Bishop deForest, is "Growing Young", "Gaining Strength".

Bishop deForest called the meeting to order.

Bishop Patricia Davenport from the Southeastern Pa. Synod led the Thursday night Worship Service with Communion. Each day we had Worship, hymn singing, and offering. Over 400 in attendance.

<u>Vice President Kristen Weiner</u>: term is up and the synod assembly voted Nancy Reichelt the new Vice President of the synod.

<u>Secretary Pastor Shankweiler</u>: term is up and the synod assembly voted Rev. Kenneth Melbar the new Secretary of the synod.

Continuation from NEPA Synod Assembly...

<u>Three Resolutions were submitted</u>, voted on and passed. Want more details, go to the website, www.nepasynod.org/2023assembly.

Bishop deForest has a vision about starting 6-2-6-1. This means: 6- congregations, 2- sharing 2 full-time ministers, 6-lay ministers, and 1- full-time deacon. Common goals: willing to share clergy and staff, calling to lift up local leaders. Deacon Kat Tigerman will be making rounds to congregations and maybe we can get her to come and explain this in more detail if we are interested.

<u>Salm Program</u>- In January, Pastor Jira Albers, was appointed "Salm Launch Coordinator" for a one-year contract position. Program to begin in 2024. A Salm: is a lay person with training and has permission from the Bishop to carry out many of the responsibilities of a pastor-including the sacraments.

Roster changes for Ministers of Word and Sacrament or Ministers of Word and Service as of May 1, 2022, and April 30, 2023. 2 ordinations, 3 received from other synods, 5 transferred to other synods, and death of Pastors 16.

One workshop was, Small Church Ministry: "Making Every Effort". According to Ephesians 4:3, Christians should be, "making every effort to maintain the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace". Sense of growth, racial diversity, open to changes, community, neighbors, and sense of mission and purpose. There were many workshops to visit.

Ministry Share Fair-Tables were set up in the hallway to share information about different mission projects, 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering, ELCA World Hunger, Diakon Social Ministries, Thrivent Financial, LGBTQIA+Ministry to name a few.

It was very interesting being my first time at the Synod Assembly and seeing how things are done. A lot of speakers, the messages, and ideas they had. It was overwhelming at times, but I was glad I had the opportunity to attend.



Church Parking Changes

The Property Team is recommending a change in church parking on Sunday mornings and other church gatherings. The following changes were discussed with the church council.

Effective immediately:

If you feel comfortable crossing the road, we are asking you to park in the parking lot in order to free the parking spaces in front of the church.

New signage will soon be displayed for our handicapped area in the front of the church.

If you are facing the church, there will be six handicapped parking spaces to the left of the front entrance. Please do not park in these spaces if you do not have a handicap sign displayed. To the right of the church entrance, parking will be available for others to park who are afraid to cross the road.

There is new signage at the entrance of the cemetery which will direct those who need wheelchair access to gain entry to the church.

Our purpose is to offer parking for those with special needs and also to help our visitors who are uncertain of where to park. Thank you for your cooperation as we implement the new parking changes.

On May 29th, the Ferry Street Fire in Easton displaced more than a dozen families and over 60 people from the row homes where they lived.

Lutheran congregations in the area responded right away. St. John's Lutheran Church, located right on Ferry Street is collecting financial donations and Pastor Susan Ruggles is participating in community meetings. Also, Pastor Jamie Edelman from United Fellowship Lutheran Church, also nearby, has been visiting the area to offer a listening presence to neighbors and survivors.

Our role as Lutheran Disaster Response in eastern PA, a program of Lutheran Congregational Services, is to support the local community when support is needed. Currently, we are participating in community meetings, helping to connect partners, and amplifying the messaging of local leaders.

There is an outpouring of community support for Ferry Street Fire survivors. The American Red Cross, United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley, and local churches and community organizations are doing a great job meeting immediate needs. There will likely be long-term unmet needs related to affordable housing.

Donations to Lutheran Disaster Response-Eastern Pennsylvania ensures LCS readiness to help create a safety net and support local community efforts when disasters like the Ferry Street fire occur. Those donations also provide direct aid to survivors for long-term recovery. As we monitor the situation, we will assess what those long-term needs may be.
