## **Worship Schedule Changes Beginning in June**


For the summer months, we will be using Setting 10 for our church liturgy. Also, there will be no Assistant Ministers for June – August.



# 6261 Presentation by Deacon Kat Tigerman on June 23, 2024

Our synod has developed a plan to help with the shortage of pastors in our synod.

The program the synod has developed is called 6261.

#### To define 6261:

6 congregations, 2 Full Time Pastors, 6 Lay Persons, 1 Deacon

Deacon Kat Tigerman has agreed to come to St. John's on June 23<sup>rd</sup> to lead our church service.

After the service, lunch will be served, followed by a 20 – 30 minute presentation By Deacon Tigerman on 6261.

#### Why, you may ask, do you need to attend?

A special congregation meeting will be called (with 3 weeks' notice) to vote on whether or not our congregation is willing to participate in this program or continue to look for a part-time pastor. The church council will not be making this decision; it will be decided by our congregation members.

So, please come to the presentation and ask questions, so your vote will be determined by what you hear, and you will then have the knowledge to make a decision for what you think is best for our congregation.

As always, if I can answer any concerns you have, please contact me and I will answer your questions from what I know of the program.

# Licensed Lay Ministry @

## In the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

#### Why Should I Consider Becoming a Licensed Lay Ministry (LLM)?

Have you ever asked yourself, "What is God calling me to do right now? How can I best serve God and my neighbor? What gifts do I have that I am not using?" If so, perhaps becoming a LLM could be the answer to those profound, discerning questions. The Church has always needed and benefited from lay leaders and the variety of gifts they bring to the Church community.

#### What Do Licensed Lay Ministers Do?

LLMs serve congregations and 6261 Ministry Communities in a variety of ways. They make themselves available for pulpit supply when a pastor is away, visit members at home and in the hospital, become assisting ministers for worship, and serve on a variety of synod and congregational committees. Some even serve as the primary minister in a congregation during a pastoral vacancy. Some participate in the LLM formation path because their pastor saw gifts in them; others want to broaden their knowledge of the Bible and the Church.

#### How Do I Start the Process to Become a Licensed Lay Minister?

To become a LLM candidate, applicants must submit the following items:

- 1. A completed application form.
- 2. A letter of reference from the applicant's pastor (or a former pastor if no current pastor).
- A letter of reference from the applicant's congregational council, along with the Congregational Education Agreement.
- Copies of Child Abuse Clearances, State Police Clearances, and FBI Clearances.

#### What Does the LLM Formation Path Look Like?

The LLM course consists of 3 parts over the course of two years:

- Foundational Courses in four areas of study: Hebrew Bible (Old Testament), Christian Scriptures (New Testament), Theology and Beliefs, and Church History
- Four Weekend Retreats focusing on Lutheran Preaching, Lutheran Worship, Lutheran Theology/Confessions, and Pastoral Care
- Mentor Guided Activities including Sermon Development, Planning and Leading Bible Study, Visitation, Prayer, and Care of Souls, and Teaching the Catechism

#### **How Much Does it Cost?**


- The LLM Formation Path costs \$1,000, which pays for 2 years of synodical weekend retreats.
- The cost of tuition for the 4 required classes taken at the candidate's chosen institution for higher learning (often online). This cost varies by institution (usually \$300 - \$750 per course).
- The cost of books for the retreats and classes.






## Worship & Art: A Congregation's Journey

A few years ago, Calvary Lutheran Church, Laureldale, set out on a journey to be as inclusive as possible. This journey led the congregation to install state-of-the-art cameras (for streaming worship), three 85-inch monitors (for reading the liturgy and music), and a new sound system (that would enable everyone to hear and engage during worship). This was the beginning of the trek to become the congregation God was calling them to be!

The people of Calvary knew they could do more to engage in worship or worshipful experiences so they asked, "How can we engage more of our bodies in worship?" They pondered, brainstormed, and listed ways they could inclusively engage their bodies in worship and Christian life. They decided that creating together would align with their values of inclusivity. This came to fruition through their first collective art project. They began with a Lenten collage that created a dark scene with the tomb of Jesus. The congregation loved the project so much that they asked for more. The next project was for Easter, which included a prominent cross and a rainbow collage surrounding and illuminating the cross. The congregation is currently working on a Pentecost piece that includes a centralized bird erupting from rings of fire. The congregation is in conversation with an art organization to place their piece on display for the wider community to enjoy.

## New Outreach Ministry is Found at POP's Treasures

POP's Treasures was established by Prince of Peace Evangelical Church in Bangor to create a location where the community/congregants can donate gently used items /clothing. Presented in a "boutique style" store front where the visitors can see creative displays and purchase said items at a fair price.



The outpouring of community involvement has far exceeded our initial plan. The community supports us with items, and they also attend monthly during the sale days. We have had several new members at the church since the boutique was opened May of 2023. Our attendees support us in other posts on Facebook, letting the community at large know of our location. We are constantly reminded how they feel that this is a wonderful program. We also have individuals who come in our doors that ask to help volunteer.

We applied for and received a Witness and Service Ministry Team Grant to help with the costs to prepare a location on our property and purchase a connex container. The container is used to repurpose and store inventory. Items not sold at the boutique, are then stored until we have our spring or fall rummage sale. Items not sold there are donated to a clothing collection box and other organizations. Currently we utilize the 2 back rooms of the church, along with part of the fellowship hall during the days of our sale, which in total in 7 hours for both days.



While our program was set up to respond at the end of the fiscal year. As we hear of a need, we act in trying to make it happen if we can. It is difficult to say how many attend during the sale days. However, recently we provided a free clothing and houseware day that was attended by 200 individuals.

We currently have provided 3 meals at Safe Harbor, a transition shelter for the homeless. We have donated children's toys, and a stroller to the foster care program. There were also monetary donations to a local youth program, animal shelter, Portland food pantry (PUMP), and the purchase of animals from ELCA Good Gifts.

You may wonder if your congregations could do the same. Yes! If the organizers have the faith it will work, be willing to make changes and to realize that there are many paths to take to make it work. Success can be measured by outreach to the community and the programs it helps. We have been blessed beyond our wildest hopes and dreams.
