Good intentions. Some unknown author put it this way:

He was going to be all that a mortal should be Tomorrow No one would be better than he Tomorrow

Each morning he stacked up the letters he'd write Tomorrow It was too bad indeed he was too busy to see Bill, but he promised to do it Tomorrow

The greatest of workers this man would have been Tomorrow The world would have known him had he ever seen Tomorrow

But the fact is he died and faded from view, and all that was left when living was through Was a mountain of things he intended to do Tomorrow.

Good intentions. Isn't it interesting how easy it is to put off doing the things we ought to do? Some of us even put off things we want to do.

If you knew that you only had a very short time to live, what changes would you make in your life? Are there promises you have made that you have not kept? Are there good intentions that you have not carried out? The sad truth of life is that we don't have much time. If you and I are going to be all that God has called us to be, we need to begin now. If we are going to do the things God has called us to do, we will need to do them now. How do we enter the kingdom of God then? By a genuine change of mind, which means doing God's will, not just thinking a few pious thoughts about doing it. The wife of Henry IV, King of France, in the 1600s, had numerous intense enemies including the Roman Catholic cardinal and her son who became king. On her deathbed, however, she promised to forgive all her enemies, including the cardinal. The priest hearing her confession asked her, "Madame, as a sign of reconciliation, will you send him the bracelet you are wearing on your arm?" "No," she stated flatly, "that would be too much." How close to the kingdom! How close, but no closer, when good intentions do not give way to action. In the end, good intentions are no substitute for doing the will of God. Words of good intention are empty if they don't lead to action. Don't put off tomorrow what you can do today





In December 1992 in Harrington, Maine, when wreath maker Morrill Worcester found himself with a surplus of 5,000 wreaths during the holiday season. Worcester saw the surplus as an opportunity to pay tribute to our country's veterans and with the help of Maine Senator Olympia Snowe, arranged for the wreaths to be placed at Arlington National Cemetery. This annual tribute to our country's veterans has continued ever since, touching the lives of millions of veterans' families and volunteers and growing in scope through the years.

In 2007, the Worcester family along with veterans and volunteers formed the non-profit organization Wreaths Across America to continue and expand their efforts at Arlington National Cemetery and to support those around the country who wished to do the same. Wreaths Across America's yearlong mission is simple: **Remember** the fallen, **Honor** those who serve, and **Teach** the next generation about the value of freedom. Morrill's wife, Karen, has served as the organization's volunteer Executive Director since the non-profit was created and today oversees what has become a massive volunteer organization that continues to grow. In 2023 alone, Wreaths Across America and its national network of volunteers placed 3 million veterans' wreaths at 4,224 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad.

This year, National Wreaths Across America Day will be held on Saturday, December 14, 2024. Locally, a ceremony will begin at 12:00 PM followed by the placement of wreaths at St. John's Lutheran and Reformed Cemetery located at 772 St. John's Road, St. Johns, PA where 400 local veterans are laid to rest. This event is open to anyone who would like to attend.

In 2023, there were approximately 281 wreaths placed, leaving 119 veterans without a remembrance wreath. This year our goal is to place 400 wreaths. With your generosity, we are hoping to meet this goal and ensure no veteran is forgotten. Each handmade, fresh, live wreath costs \$17 to sponsor and is made in the United States with Maine balsam.

On behalf of the volunteers and military families looking to honor all the veterans laid to rest at St. John's Lutheran and Reformed Cemetery and the Wreaths Across America extended family, I thank you for your consideration of this patriotic cause. I'll be in touch to determine your interest in supporting the mission to Remember, Honor, and Teach.

LWR Ingathering: Can you believe we filled the Truck!



On Saturday, September 21, the NEPA Synod hosted our first local Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Ingathering to collect Mission Quilts and Kits destined for the Baltimore warehouse. Congregations collect donations and assemble various LWR kits – Personal Care, School, Baby Care or Fabric kits – for their "God's Work. Our Hands." service projects. Quilts are typically made all year long with a celebration Blessing of the Quilts and Kits through the fall season. Our LWR Ingathering was scheduled to coincide with these activities, to collect donations and coordinate transportation to the Baltimore warehouse. As a new venture, we were very curious to see the turnout from local churches.

As is typical with our Synod, the response was AMAZING! During our 3 hour collection period, cars, trucks and vans kept coming filled with as many boxes as could be carried! Most congregations brought Personal Care Kits totaling 570 kits from Trinity Lutheran in Robesonia, St. John's Lutheran in Stroudsburg, Trinity Lutheran in Topton, Trinity Lutheran in Perkasie, Zion Lutheran in Womelsdorf, Emmanuel's Lutheran in Emmanuelville and St. John's Lutheran in Allentown. The largest quantity donated were School Kits totaling 595 kits from Zion Lutheran in Womelsdorf, Good Shepherd Lutheran in Northampton and St. Stephen's Lutheran in Bethlehem. Fifty-four (54) Mission Quilts were collected from St. John's Lutheran in Slatington, St. Paul's Lutheran in Douglassville and St. John's Lutheran in Allentown. Fourteen (14) Baby Care kits were collected from St. John's Lutheran in Allentown.

On October 12, through the generous donation of Kristi Parcel-Smith of Remax in Allentown, we drove her company's truck to

Christ Lutheran Church in Reading to collect donations from three additional churches. We added more boxes containing 207 Mission Quilts from Reformation Lutheran in Reading and Robeson Lutheran in Plowville. We also added 110 Personal Care Kits from Nativity Lutheran in Reading and St. Paul's in Reading. We continued our journey on to Bergstrasse Lutheran Church in Ephrata where volunteers loaded our boxes onto a tractor-trailer headed to Baltimore on Monday, October 14. What an amazing outpouring of love for our neighbors in need!

Typically, LWR Quilts and Kits are sent around the world. Following Hurricane Helene, LWR Quilts and Personal Care Kits are being distributed throughout the devastated areas in the Carolinas and Georgia. Donations at our Ingathering represent only a portion of the total contributions to LWR from our Synod, as some congregations ship their donations directly to the Baltimore warehouse or attend a closer Ingathering. Several of our churches bring their donations to an Ingathering in Auburn, PA, and three churches delivered their donations directly to Bergstrasse Church.
