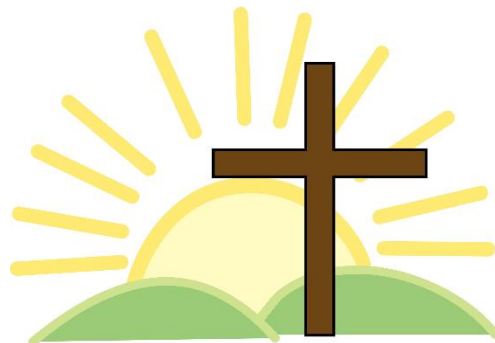

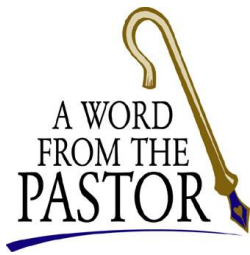

From Pastor Michele Kaufman:

It is that season of the Church's year when we as Christians dwell on the Mystery of the Crucifixion. And what the Crucifixion tells us is this: God Himself died upon a cross, to pour out His love for us, to forgive us our sins, to share His life with us now, and eternally.

Too many people move from Palm Sunday's jubilation to Easter's victory and never take the excruciating walk through the Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Trials, and Mount Calvary. But you must go through it all really to know the joy of the open tomb! Let us examine what Our Lord went through even physically in His love for us: in His suffering, His Passion, and His crucifixion: in His agony in the Garden, in His scourging at the pillar, in His crowning with thorns, in His carrying the cross to Calvary, in His crucifixion and death. As we more deeply realize this, what God went through in His love for us, we will hopefully realize more deeply the love that God has for us, for you and for me. 4 Look at the cross. Empty and unoccupied, it is simply an object of brass or the timbers of a tree; but, when the crucified and suffering body of Jesus Christ is placed on the historic cross of Calvary, it becomes a sword - a sword in the hand of God that can conquer everything in heaven and on earth. It can even destroy the very gates of hell. Alleluia! Rejoice! Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord!

Congregational Meeting to Purchase a Carillon:

The council approved a motion to buy carillon. The first announcement of a congregational meeting will be made on 3/16. The second announcement will be on 3/23. The third and final announcement will be on 3/30. At that time, a congregational meeting will be held after church services to discuss the system and vote on purchasing the upgraded system.

Treasurer's Report:

- We had to move \$3,000 from the Mundie Fund to the General Fund to cover expenses. This was due to church services being canceled for two weeks in February due to bad weather.
- We reinvested monies from the Snyder Scholarship Fund that was invested in an FNB CD that is currently in the Parsonage Fund and coming due in April.

- The Easter flowers are the same price as last year.

- A collection for Holy Joe's Café will be upcoming.
- The Kindness Tree Project raised \$49 to be used for VBS.
- Jan Jacobus will be starting up the Divine Providence project in April. Melody Hinderer applied for and received a \$500 grant for this project.
- The Sausage and Pancake Supper will be held on May 3rd. Help is needed, along with 600 cupcakes.
- Patty Phile is planning a Spring Mother/Daughter Tea.
- Donna will look into candy sales as a possible fundraiser.

Property Team:

- Lines need to be painted in parking lot – Jim reached out to a few people to have the lot sealed this year.
- Heat in Shuster Education Building to be looked at – Klesh hasn't returned Jim's call yet. Don will look into other businesses that can hopefully look at this.

Continuation of the highlighted version of the March Council Meeting...

- Elevator inspection? Jim hasn't heard back from the department that does the inspections.
- Property inspection is scheduled for Wednesday, March 26th. Jim and Don Jr. will be present.
- Still need to look into Steve's Lawn Care and Four Diamonds for snow and ice removal.
- Patty said that the motion light at the handicapped parking area doesn't turn on quickly enough.

Lay Eucharist: Judy and Melody are going to visit next Wednesday and Thursday.

Call Committee:

- A possible candidate decided to move to South Dakota to accept a call.
- Don Jr. mentioned that there may be another candidate interested in a full-time call, that we will need to share with another parish. Waiting on information from the SYNOD.

225th Anniversary Team:

- Melody currently has the church's historical items from the anniversary at her house. It was suggested to install a shelving unit or cases in the St. Stephen's room where these items could be displayed instead of being buried again or packed up and put away upstairs. Don Jr. will ask Jim Cassarella for ideas for the shelving units. The hole outside the church where the time capsules were previously buried will be filled in.

Old Business:

- Melody received a \$ 500 grant from the Hazleton Lehighon Mission District for the Divine Providence meals. We can apply for this grant money every year.
- Pastor Michele will speak to our representative from Thrivent about speaking to our members at a future date about joining Thrivent so we can get more Action Team cards for future events.

New Business:

I attended a Mission district Meeting for Council Presidents only.

- The Mission District and SYNOD assembly is May 30 – 31, 2025 at Christ Hamilton United Lutheran Church in Stroudsburg, PA. We need 1 male and 1 female to represent us. This will be added to the bulletin.
- Donnie Jr. brought back a book titled Growing Young. It talks about how to get folks involved with the church, no matter their age or how long they have been with the church.
- We will host the next meeting on June 8th from 2:30 pm to 4:30 pm. Light snacks will be available.
- Greeting others during the Offering of Peace was discussed. We will move forward with optional handshakes and greetings as members are comfortable with doing.
- Bishop deForest Chat and Chew meeting report was discussed. It was last held at Christ Lutheran. The Mission Support lost \$100,000 last year. Their investments are doing well. Our Synod has 237 congregations and 80 clergy members. We are the largest congregation in our district. The average attendance is 46 every Sunday. Davey and Goliath programs will be brought back. We will start sharing the Peace via our phones starting this Sunday.
- The Spring Mission District meeting will be at our church on Sunday 4/27. Registration begins at 2 pm and the meeting starts at 3 pm. Our annual dues need to be paid. Light refreshments will be available. Volunteers are needed to join and help out. Melody's 3-year term is up. They have 3 – 4 meetings every year. We will be reimbursed up to \$100 for food and refreshment purchases.
- The younger Scouts are still interested in assisting at a Scout Sunday service.

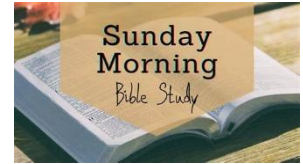

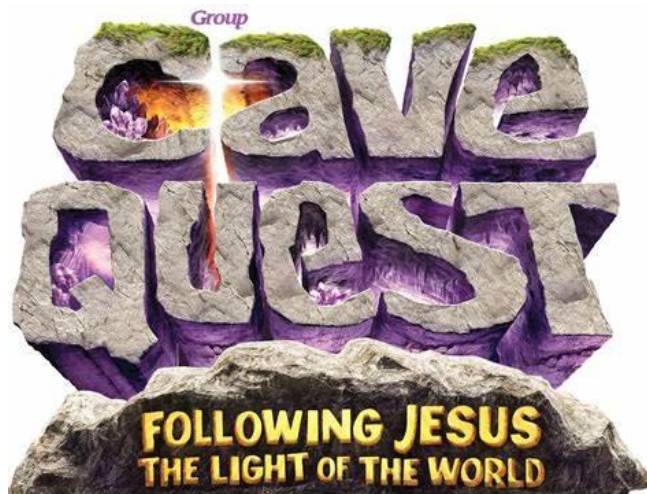

6261:

Something New, Yet Something Old

6261 : 6 congregations sharing 2 full-time pastors, 6 Licensed Lay Ministers (LLMs), and 1 full-time deacon. A parish-type model first presented by Bishop Christopher deForest at the Synod Assembly of 2023. A flexible framework to help congregations collaborate and thrive, while remaining unique and true to their own God-given gifts. A model designed to vitalize each congregation as together, they expand their ministries within the

community. A focus on the Gospel by increasing opportunities for worship, Bible studies, service, music, and ministry into the community.

There are currently 15 different areas across the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod at various discernment and exploration points about 6261. There is at least one area in each of the Synod's 9 Mission Districts.

The Synod's first 6261 Ministry Community officially launched on February 1, 2025 in Reading, PA as the "Pretzel City." This partnership includes six congregations: Bethany Lutheran (West Reading), Christ Lutheran (Reading), Hope Lutheran (Reading), Nativity Lutheran (Reading), St. Paul Lutheran (Reading), and Zion Spies Lutheran (Reading) along with Hope's Table (a Synod-Authorized Worshipping Community).

On February 19th, the Pretzel City 6261 Ministry Community hosted a potluck dinner, hymn sing, and celebration worship, co-lead by Bishop deForest and Deacon Kat Tigerman. In addition to the six Pretzel City congregations and 2 of their LLM candidates, members of Synod Council and congregations from around the Synod and West Berks Mission District attended to mark this momentous occasion.

The celebration worship included a reflection on the primary ministry project of the Pretzel City 6261: a food web ministry. Pastor Rebecca Knox gave this reflection, drawing on Psalm 126 and how God brought these congregations to this joyful point and will be with them as they continue to plant seeds, both literally and spiritually. Bishop deForest led a participatory reflection on Isaiah 58 including loud shouts of praise and the kind of fasting God wants: for us to love, heal, and engage with our neighbors. Bishop deForest also lifted up the sacrifice each congregation made for the good of the whole 6261 Ministry Community so that it could more fully live into this “fasting” call of service. The 6261 Ministry Community Covenant was signed by each President of the 6



congregations, and each congregation received a Pretzel City plaque as a reminder of their partnership and commitment to pray for one another. A joint 30-person choir sang “Lord, We As One United,” a beautiful anthem for the offertory right after members from each congregation and Pastor Bruce Osterhout led the assembly in prayer. Worship concluded with Holy Communion and a special update from Pastor Drew Neidig celebrating some surprise gifts to the Pretzel City Bundle to help with their food web ministry. We are blessed to see such hope among us in such unprecedented times. We celebrate with Pretzel City, knowing that God goes before each of us on our ministry journeys so that we may have life abundantly (John 10:10).
